# About Tonight's Program

## Orange Sherbet

Sammy Nestico wrote the original arrangement of this piece for the Count Basie big band in the 1970's. It has become a standard of big band repertoire and is a wonderful example of Nesitco's classic writing style. The tune got its title thanks to Count Basie's love of orange sherbet. Featuring: Alexandre Lesieutre, Ken Mohr, Luke Soto

## Jingle Bells

This arrangement of a familiar holiday classic was crafted to feature the bass trombone as a soloist. Tom Kubis is a fantastic arranger and leads a Big Band under his own name in Los Angeles region. His arrangements seem to showcase his musical sense of humor and wit. Featuring: Evan Kuske

## Big Band Holiday

This is a festive collection of holiday melodies by composer Carl Strommen, see if you can pick them all out! Featuring: Hayden Price, Luke Rader

## Squatty Roo

This arrangement comes from the Clayton/Hamilton Big Band and is a fantastic rendition that really features the role of the rhythm section and multiple soloists. Featuring: Alexandre Lesieutre, Hayden Price, Holly Schroeder, Quinn Thronton, Luke Rader

### Flourishes!

The title of this piece speaks to its stylistic character. Composer William Owens uses numerous melodic fragments which fit together as a series of flourishes and resemble the quality of a fanfare.

### Celtic Air and Dance

As the tittle of this piece implies it is an arrangement of two traditional Celtic melodies. The first is titled *The Parting Glass* and was traditionally sung as someone mounted their horse to leave on a journey. It was a tradition to offer them a final drink before they parted and to sing them a song for the road. The second melody is titled *Tha Mi Sgith* (A Fairy's Love Song) and is sometimes performed at a slower tempo but is presented in this arrangement as a quick and lively dance.

## **Byzantine Dances**

This work is a collection of traditional Turkish Dances assembled and arranged by composer Carol Brittin Chambers. The slow section in the middle of this piece is based on the music characteristic of a Zeybek dance. This dance is often performed by a soloist and is meant to symbolize courage and heroism with out-stretched arms.

#### White Christmas

Michael Sweeney arranged this classic for wind band and we hope that you enjoy it. The original song was written for the film *Holiday Inn* and started Bing Crosby and Fred Astaire.

#### Fanfare and Flourishes

There is nothing like a good fanfare to open a concert set. This original work by James Curnow contains all the classic characteristics one would expect from a fanfare.

#### Ukrainian Bell Carol

A familiar holiday selection which we are more accustomed to calling *Carol of the Bells*, however, the original melody of this song comes from a Ukrainian composer by the name of Mykola Leontovich who composed it in 1916. The song's original title, "Shchedryk," roughly translates to, "bountiful," and the lyrics tell the story of a sparrow which flies into a family's home to proclaim a year of good fortune. In Ukraine this melody is therefore usually sung at the time of the Julian New Year in January and is not associated with the Christmas Holiday.

The English Lyrics which are now familiar her in the United States were written in 1936 by Peter Wilhousky when he rearranged the melody for the NBC Radio Symphony Orchestra. The music quickly became a staple of the holiday season as the four-note motif clearly elicits the image of ringing silver bells and holiday cheer.

#### In The Bleak Midwinter

The words of this carol are originally by English Poet Christina Rossetti and were published in 1872. Later they were set to music by composer Gustav Holst.

#### Let it Snow

We hope that you enjoy Dr. Johnnie Vinson's fun arrangement of this classic. A particularly amusing fact about this piece is that it was written in July in Hollywood California during a heat wave in 1945. The composers were dreaming of cooler weather and there are no mentions of any holiday festivities in the lyrics, however, when the piece was released during the holiday months later in the year it quickly rose to number one of the billboard list and remains one of the bestselling compositions of all time. Vaughn Monroe was the first to record the track and his recording session took place on October 31st that year. Nowadays it seems we hear his recording as early as November 1st.

#### The Holly and the Ivy

The Holly and the Ivy is a traditional British folk Christmas carol. A contemporary setting of the carol produces a magical holiday moment with fleeting rhythmic patterns combined with light touches of jazz.

### O Most Holy Mystery

Tomas Luis De Victoria was born in Avilas, Spain in 1548 and died in Madrid in 1611. He was the greatest Spanish composer of the Renaissance, and wrote some of the finest church music of the time. He composed many motets, over twenty masses (including his well-known Missa Papae Marcelli), and eighteen magnificats. His hymns and Marian antiphons are equally outstanding. His motet\* O Most Holy Mystery (O Magnum Mysterium) is presented here in a lovely chorale-style setting that allows myriad opportunities for expressive playing. The text is based on the following thoughts:

O most holy mystery and wondrous miracle of God's mercy, That on this holy night to us the Child Divine was born, and laid in a manger.

#### Of Sailors & Whales

Of Sailors and Whales is a five-movement work based on five scenes from Herman Melville's Moby Dick. It was commissioned by and is dedicated to the California Band Directors Association, Inc., and was premiered in February 1990 by the California All-State Band, conducted by the composer. *Narration: Sir Mike Dyer* 

- I. Ishmael "I go to sea as a simple sailor"
- II. Queequeg "It was quite plain that he must be some abominable savage, but Queequeg was a creature in the transitory state neither caterpillar nor butterfly."
- III. Father Mapple "This ended, in prolonged solemn tones, like the continual tolling of a bell in a ship that is foundering at sea in a fog in such tones he commenced reading the following hymn; but changing his manner towards the concluding stanzas, burst forth with a pealing exultation and joy."
- IV. Ahab "So powerfully did the whole grim aspect of Ahab affect me that for the first few moments I hardly noted the barbaric white leg upon which he partly stood."
- V. The White Whale "Moby Dick seemed combinedly possessed by all the angels that fell from heaven. The birds! the birds! They mark the spot."

## Sleigh Ride

Leroy Anderson's well known and iconic piece of Christmas music, Sleigh Ride, was rather ironically written in July, at the Anderson summer home in Woodbridge, CT, during a heat wave. The composition is still ranked as one of the 10 most popular pieces of Christmas music worldwide.
