About Tonight's Program

Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band

Celebrating 40 years since The Beatles and Sgt. Pepper "taught the band to play," here is a medley of some of the best-known hits from what many consider the best album of the rock era. Includes: *Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band*; *Lucy in the Sky with Diamonds*; *When I'm Sixty-Four*; *She's Leaving Home* and *With a Little Help from My Friends*.

Jupiter Hymn

The planet Jupiter was hailed as the ruler of all other planets, and in this enchanting hymn, we are treated to a truly Edwardian tune filled with nobility. This song was so revered by people that Holst transformed it into a church hymn that is still loved around Britain to this day and is the theme song of the Rugby World Cup. All across the world Jupiter still upholds its name as the bringer of jollity, filling everyone who hears it with pure bliss.

Fantasmic!

Bringing the magic of seeing the Disneyland sky light up with fireworks to your concert stage. This arrangement features magically captivating themes that just like Disney's firework show, explore imagination in a beautiful and spellbinding journey.

Capriccio Espagnol

Although Rimsky-Korsakov revered Russian folk music, he was also interested in the music of other countries. He had been to Spain once early in his life, yet he was hypnotized by its music. *Capriccio Espagnol* is an exuberant representation of a musical culture that he clearly adored. Written in 1887, the work was met with immediate success; upon its first reading, the orchestra burst into enthusiastic applause, and the audience at the premiere demanded an encore. Rimsky-Korsakov later wrote of the enduringly popular work, "According to my plans, the *Capriccio* was to glitter with dazzling orchestral color and, manifestly, I had not been wrong."

Heroes of the Marvel Universe

Some of the most impressive movie themes in recent years have come from the blockbuster Marvel superhero films. This dynamic and well-paced medley features memorable hero themes including *Captain America*; *Ant-Man*; *Thor*; *Iron Man*; *Black Panther* and of course, *The Avengers*.

Gabriel's Oboe

Gabriel's Oboe was written by Morricone as the main theme of the 1986 motion picture *The Mission*. Directed by Roland Joffe, the film is set in the imperial era of Spain and Portugal. In the film, the musical theme is most prominently used when the Jesuit Father Gabriel (Jeremy Irons) walks up to a waterfall and starts playing his oboe, aiming to befriend the natives with his music so he can carry on his missionary work in the New World. *The Mission* was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Original Score, and won the Golden Globe for Best Original Score.

Cantina Band

A long time ago in a galaxy far, far away... No one who lived through the 1970s and early 1980s is likely to forget the initial impact of George Lucas's *Star Wars* movies. They were stupendous box office hits, but they also had a lasting impact on American movies. Part of the success of the *Star Wars* epics were the film scores. One of the most iconic movie melodies all of time, the timelessly charming groove of Cantina Band will be sure to have everybody in the audience tapping their toes along with the jazzy melodies.

Young Person's Guide to John Williams

The title of this composition is a play on Benjamin Britten's *Young Person's Guide to the Orchestra*. Movie goers have been treated to the masterful film scores of John Williams for decades. Here's a collection of some of his most memorable melodies, including Prologue from *Hook*, Theme from *E.T.*, Hedwig's Theme and *Raiders March*.

Phantom of the Opera

Andrew Lloyd Webber's musical sensation brings us some of the most moving and dramatic moments ever to hit Broadway! Warren Barker's captivating arrangement includes: Think Of Me; Angel of Music; All I Ask of You; The Music of the Night and The Phantom of the Opera.

The Seventh Night of July

In Japan, July the 7th is a holiday known as Tanabata, for which large celebrations are held throughout the country. The holiday is based on a legend about a young man and a young woman who are separated by the Milky Way and can only see each other once a year on this night. *The Seventh Night of July* is Itaru Sakai's musical interpretation of this romantic legend. The alto saxophone and euphonium solos during the middle movement represent the two main themes from the legend.
